## Faith and Believing

<u>II Corinthians 13:5, 6</u> – "<u>Examine yourselves as to whether you are in the faith</u>. <u>Test yourselves</u>. Do you not know yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you?—unless indeed you are <u>disqualified</u>. <sup>6</sup>But I trust that you will know that we are not <u>disqualified</u>."

- "<u>examine yourselves</u>" take a close look at your life (of faith), particularly your thoughts and behavior. [<u>Imperative</u>]
- "<u>test yourselves</u>" take a close look at your life (of faith) to see whether it is genuine or not. [as metals] [<u>Imperative</u>]
- "<u>disqualified</u>" not genuine. [Not questioning salvation, but are they actually walking in the faith they profess]

**Hebrews 11:6** – But without **faith** it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must **believe** that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him.

- **Faith** (PISTIS Noun) persuasion; moral conviction of the truthfulness of God; assurance, belief, fidelity.
  - o Something I have. [Mk. 11:22; Rm. 12:3; II Peter 1:1]
  - o Wrong belief = if God gives me some faith...
- **Believe** (PISTEUO Verb) to think to be true, to be persuaded of, to credit, place confidence in; to entrust a thing to one.
  - o Something I do.
  - o Believe in your heart immovable trust.
  - o Confess with your mouth.

<u>Matthew 9:27-31</u> – When Jesus departed from there, two blind men followed Him, crying out and saying, "Son of David, have mercy on us!"

- Note: Some say they didn't receive (yet) because they referred to Jesus as "Son of David." [A messianic title]
  - o <u>Isaiah 35:5</u> Then <u>the eyes of the blind shall be opened</u>, and the ears of the deaf shall be unstopped.
- Note also that you couldn't say they weren't sincere.

- **Notice** that Jesus didn't say to the two blind men, "Well, because you are sincere and honest, go your way and see." Although people should be sincere, they must also believe.
- **Note**: These two blind men who followed Jesus from Jairus' house, <u>crying</u>, "*Thou Son of David, have mercy on us*," were still blind after calling out to Jesus.
- <sup>28</sup> And when He had come into the house, the blind men came to Him. And Jesus said to them, "Do you believe that I am able to do this?" They said to Him, "Yes, Lord."
  - **Note**: Even when they came into the house into the Presence of Jesus they were still blind.
  - Jesus' question: "Do you believe?" Their answer: "Yes, Lord!"
- <sup>29</sup> Then He touched their eyes, saying, "<u>According to your faith let it be</u> to you." <sup>30</sup> And their eyes were opened. And Jesus sternly warned them, saying, "See that no one knows it." <sup>31</sup> But when they had departed, they spread the news about Him in all that country.
  - **Note** when they <u>believed</u>, they <u>had!</u>
  - **John 6:47** Most assuredly, I say to you, he who **believes** in Me **has** everlasting life.
    - o **Note: vs. 29** contains what could be called the great law of faith: "according to your faith let it be to you."
